Throughout this workshop, Clean Cooking Madagascar explained about the the upcomming request for Tender for partnership with Pilot Micro Distillery, this request is open for anyone who wants to be a shareholder of this pilot distillery, which will be implemented in the beginning of 2017 in Madagascar. Anyone who wants to be part of the program can also sign a contract with Clean Cooking Madagascar in order to become our Local Project Implementation Partner.
