Clean Cooking Madagascar is an NGO promoting clean renewable energy to households in Madagascar. The primary role is to promote and support the expansion of the Madagascar Ethanol Stove Program and to ensure that all parties involved in this program comply with the program requirements to ensure the highest quality of all aspects of this program. The goal of this program is to have 100,000 ethanol stoves distributed to households in Madagascar by 2020. These are cost effective initiatives that will ensure A BETTER LIVING for households in Madagascar while at the same time have a great development value for Madagascar as a whole.

## Clean Cooking Madagascar wants to certify Micro distilleries

Any micro distillery that seeks to provide ethanol to any Local Project Implementation Partner needs to be certified. Certification enables supplier to sell the ethanol to any Local Project Implementation Partner in the Madagascar Ethanol Stove Program and will enable them to get technical and managerial support from Clean Cooking Madagascar. Any micro distillery that wants to be certified as an ethanol supplier is invited to contact Clean Cooking Madagascar. Clean Cooking Madagascar will set up and manage a pilot micro-distillery early next year in Madagascar. The goal of this pilot micro-distillery is to provide demonstration and training facility for the micro-distilleries invested by local partners in Madagascar.

There is still hope that the Malagasy government will clarify the potential tax liability for partners that consider engaging in the production or distribution of denatured ethanol used as cooking fuel. Clean Cooking Madagascar

does not make an opinion of the legality of a Decree in Madagascar as we are not directly involved with the implementation and hence the tax which this decree refer to.

## The launching of SAFI Cookers in Madagascar

SAFI SARLU has started their projects in Madagascar and Safi stoves are now available for sales through kiosks that has been trained and certified



for selling Safi Ethanol Stoves. A single burner Safi Cooker are currently sold at a very competitive launching price of AR 49.000.

Those SAFI cookers are distributed by nineteen kiosks all over Antananarivo and ten kiosks in Toamasina. Demo stands and SAFI signs are hang on each kiosk's wall so that everyone can recognize the kiosks.

## The visit of the World Bank at Clean Cooking Madagascar's office

**W**orld Bank representatives from Washington DC office will come to Madagascar to observe the status of the Madagascar Ethanol Stove Program. The World Bank, as the trustee of Ci-Dev fund, provides support to this program through results-based payment in the form of purchase of carbon credits. During this site visit, technical experts related to Micro Distilleries might also be available and might then provide some preliminary advice and recommendations related to those that are considering investing in a Micro Distillery as part of the Madagascar Ethanol Stove Program.
