

THE WORLD BANK RECRUITS / MADAGASCAR

TECHNICAL ASSISTANT FOR THE PROMOTION OF THE ETHANOL FUEL SECTOR IN MADAGASCAR

Context:

Ci-Dev or Carbon-initiative for Development is a carbon credit funds managed by the carbon finance department of the world bank which has as mission to use the financing based on the result to promote access to clean and renewable energy in developing countries. Madagascar benefitted from a carbon financing from Ci-Dev to implement the “Madagascar Ethanol Stove Program”

This program aims to replace the use of charcoal and firewood by encouraging households to use ethanol fuel. The goal of the program is to distribute 100.000 ethanol stoves by 2020 and is using the carbon financing to facilitate access of households in Madagascar to ethanol stoves.

Several entities are operational in the ethanol fuel sector while other entities expressed their interests in developing this sector. The activities in the ethanol sector include: collection, production, transformation, commercialization, storage, distribution of ethanol fuel as well as ethanol stoves. However, one of the biggest challenges that these entities are facing is the procurement of different authorizations to formalize their activities: administrative procedures are not always clear and are generally long

In this framework, the world bank recruits a consultant to support the different entities and actors to clarify existing administrative procedures, propose improvement, and accompany them to formalize their activities.

Objective:

The goal of the mission is to improve the environment of the sector in order to promote the ethanol fuel sector. More precisely, the consultant will have to:

- 1) Clarify the different procedures and steps necessary for the different authorizations required for promotional activities of ethanol fuel and propose improvement
- 2) Support and accompany entities and actors (Micro distilleries, distributors,...) in the regularization / formalization of their activities.

Extent of the services

The mission will include the following:

Support the Inter-Ministerial Committee in charge of the promotion of ethanol fuel (CTPNEC) in the clarification of the steps and procedures for the acquisition of authorizations for each of the activities of the ethanol fuel sector:

- 1) Finalize the list of steps for the various authorizations, coming from different ministerial departments, with different documents, the timings, costs, contact. This document will include steps from the authorization of production of ethanol fuel to distribution to final consumers;
- 2) Validate the list with the concerned administrative officials;
- 3) Propose improvements/innovations to facilitate procedures;
- 4) Ensure the implementation of the provided improvements: validate the proposals and propose the corresponding action plans

Using the procedures defined in section 3.1, the Consultant will accompany the operators involved in the production and distribution of ethanol and stoves, existing or new, in the formalization of their activities:

- 1) Familiarization with the procedures
- 2) Support for the constitution of the corresponding files
- 3) Support in obtaining the necessary authorizations.

Deliverables

The Consultant will submit to the World Bank and to CTPNEC reports in electronic version, including:

- Deliverable 1: A list of the different steps of administrative procedures, with the necessary documents, timing, cost and the different responsible, validated by the actors. The document will serve as a tool for investors. To submit one month after signature of the contract.
- Deliverable 2: A progress report on the formalization of activities: 2 micro distillers and 2 distributors of ethanol fuel and ethanol stove with all the necessary authorizations for their activities. To submit 5 months after the signing of the contract.
- Deliverable 3: A final report summarizing the mission including accomplishments, lessons learned, operators who have acquired their permissions: 4 micro distillers and 4 distributors of ethanol fuel and stoves with all the necessary authorizations for their activities. To submit 10 months after signing the contract.

Profiles and qualifications of the consultant

The mandate will be given to a national individual consultant with the following profile:

- Holder of a university degree in economics, law, agronomy, or equivalent;
- At least 15 years of professional experience;
- Proven experience in the development of the private sector and/or the 3 p (Public Private Partnership)
- Very good knowledge of administrative procedures in the industrial sector;
- Good knowledge of the legal and regulatory framework of the ethanol fuel sector;
- Experience in the development of sectors or value chains would be an asset;
- Good knowledge of the ethanol fuel sector.

Duration of the service

The maximum duration of the intervention is estimated at 60 days spread over a period not exceeding 10 months.
